### **Fabric**

#### Maintenance

One of the best ways to keep our outdoor fabrics looking good is to properly maintain the fabrics. This can be accomplished by simply brushing off dirt before it becomes embedded in the fabric, wiping up spills or cleaning soon after a stain occurs. This helps aid in the complete removal of a stain. The longer spills and stains remain on the fabric, the more difficult they can be to remove.

#### Hand washing

- Soak fabric in a solution of 1/4 cup mild soap per gallon (= 4 Liter) of lukewarm water.
- Use a sponge or a soft bristle brush as necessary
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue
- Air dry

#### Machine washing

Machine wash in cold water. Depending on wash load size, use normal amounts of mild laundry detergent and add 1 cup of bleach. Allow fabric to air dry. Be sure any zippered casings are closed prior to machine washing.

#### Warning

The fabric should only be allowed to air dry. DO NOT use a steamer or iron set to steam setting.

By following above described easy maintenance tips, your Wildspirit fabric will last a long time. It will not only look beautiful, but it will bring you many years of enjoyment.

## Fabric A - Aquaclean

#### Maintenance

Thanks to the AquaClean technology, you can use just water to clean occasional stains like wine, coffee, food, etc., and also the more stubborn stains on parts of the fabric that cannot be uncovered for cleaning. To completely remove the toughest stains like permanent markers, add water and a dab of soap. It is advisable to use a vacuum cleaner regularly to remove dust.

#### Clean with water

- Remove any excess product that has spilled on the fabric.
- Apply water to the stain, either directly or using a paper tissue or an absorbent cloth, without making the upholstery too damp. Wait for a few seconds.
- Press the stain with the paper tissue or cloth, then gently rub the fabric with circular strokes. If the stain does not disappear completely, repeat the process as many times as necessary.
